Our political system has seen some of the most trying moments It has ever experienced.


Family and friends disagree with one another over a whole host of issues and that disagreement has led to further division within our nation.

The food pantry continues to get several new families each week (without dropping any of our old families! Because of the corona, loss or decrease of income, and the inability of stretching dollars – our pantry has




become a beacon ever so needed. With that bad news, the good news — we are meeting the needs of approximately 140-150 families each month with a full basket of food: frozen meat, baked goods, dry goods, canned goods, personal hygiene items, and even produce! The food flies out the door, but with your help, the help of our community, Weis donations, Baltimore County and Maryland Food Bank, and CCBC — we continue to be successful. No one of need has been turned away. We have increased how many people we help in the 3 hours the pantry is open on Wednesdays, Fridays, and Saturdays. We have remained corona free by keeping social distancing a must and all clients are

able to be served in less than 5 minutes after their arrival. Thank you for your food donations, for your monetary donations, for those that volunteer at the pantry or distribution days – you make PHUMC Food Pantry the beacon it is for Baltimore County! Please know, that your continued help will get us through the upcoming most difficult times – winter and corona!

COVID-19 Guidelines

If you do not feel safe returning to in-person, indoor worship at this time, please do not feel any pressure to do so. Our worship services will be live streamed through Facebook Live on Sunday mornings and posted for viewing later.

If you are feeling unwell—or if you know that you have been exposed to anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19—we urge you to err on the side of caution and stay home.

If you do attend worship and later test positive for the virus, we ask that you let us know. While we will not divulge your name without your permission, we feel an obligation to let others know they may have been exposed.

Please remember, Little Jewels Children's Center operates under strict parameters from the state, as well as an obligation as the people of God to care for one another. Because of that we are closing the bathrooms on the first floor for public use. When entering the building, please do not congregate in the areas on the first floor.

We will continue to worship at 10:00 a.m. Sunday School will continue to meet virtually.

In order to attend, we are asking that you "make a reservation". Each week there will be a **Sign-Up Genius** on the Internet for you to use by **Thursday 12 noon**. Link can be found at:

Masks will be required without exception. If you do not have a mask (or forget to bring one), masks will be available. Those who feel they cannot mask because of health reasons are asked to worship remotely from their homes. If (in addition to a mask) you feel safer wearing a face shield, gloves, or mittens, by all means do so.

We are limiting access to the building to the front door and the back door. You will be greeted, asked to sign in and have your temperature taken. At that time, you will be allowed to enter the sanctuary and find a seat in the marked off areas. Family groups may sit together.

Hand sanitizer will be available at every door and its use is strongly advised.

In order to observe safe distancing, our sanctuary can accommodate **60 people seated** (plus the worship leaders). **Please be flexible**. We are all creatures of habit and prefer to sit in our regular seats, but these extraordinary circumstances will require patience and cooperation. Insisting on a particular seat might prevent someone else from being able to be seated in the sanctuary.

After the service, please stay in your seat **until you are dismissed**. We will be dismissing by rows beginning in the back. You are asked to **leave the building immediately**. We urge you to greet and converse with other members of the congregation outside the building at a safe distance. We have all missed each other and crave a chance to catch up, but close contact, shaking hands, or embracing could put us all at risk.

There will be **no coffee hour or fellowship meals** for the foreseeable future.

There will be no congregational singing. We will be using soloists and instrumentalists to add to our worship experience. We will also explore alternatives such as humming, "spoken word," or reading lyrics in unison. Soloists, liturgists, and preachers will be 12 - 20 feet away from the congregation.

Communion will be celebrated the first Sunday of each month. **Pre-packaged juice cups with wafer**s will be placed on the pews. One person from each family is encouraged to pick up enough for each person in your group without touching the others

Hymnals and other materials will be removed from the pews. No bulletins will be distributed but you may print and bring your own. Please **take everything with yo**u when you leave: papers, empty Communion cups, tissues, etc.

The **second-floor restrooms** will be open. Each restroom will be stocked with non-latex gloves, disinfectant spray and wipes. Each person using the restroom is urged to sanitize the restroom before and after use:

Spraying or wiping surfaces you will touch/have touched: doorknobs (outside and inside the restroom), faucet, soap dispenser, flush handle, light switch, and/or grab bars. To kill viruses and other bacteria, surfaces should remain wet for at least 60 seconds.

Please remember to wash your hands with soap long enough to sing Amazing Grace. Avoid touching your face.

While we cannot require or even suggest that you get a Flu shot, we encourage you to discuss the efficacy of taking this preventative measure with your healthcare provider.
