While I never thought at the age of 61, I would be seeking retirement I do believe it is the best decision for my family and myself.



DECEMBER Updates: HOLIDAY BASKETS



The Thanksgiving Holiday Basket was a great success – 46 families received your wonderful gift – all the fixings for a great Thanksgiving Dinner! (from the \$15 gift card for their turkey/ham to the dessert of brownies/cake!)

Because of your kindness, the bags

were filled and the families were so grateful! Even the weather cooperated – chilly but sunny!

The Christmas Holiday Basket preparation is going very, very well! In fact, we will have enough baskets for all the 50 families that have registered (and maybe even 60 families!) The distribution will take place on Saturday, December 17th from 10 – 12. The items are the same and we will continue to collect all the way through December 16th! We need mostly – the \$15 gift cards; boxes of corn muffins, boxes of mashed potatoes, frosting for the cake mixes, and cans of mixed vegetables. Do know that any and all extra items collected will be given to families that come through the pantry – so your generosity will make families happy throughout the holidays!

One last item we would love to add to the bags - a new hat or pair of gloves for adults. We have been adding 'these gifts' to the bags, but we need about 10/15 more donations. Just adding a little surprise makes the bags more special.

We have about 6/7 more openings for families that would like to receive a holiday basket. The families who receive a holiday basket come from everywhere (they are not necessarily a panty family). So if you

The pantry has been very, very busy these past few months. We are now serving about 145 families in a

thirty-day period. This is almost at the level we served during the height of the pandemic. But with the generosity of you and Camp Chapel UMC and the community food drives – we continue to meet the needs of so many! Last week we received over 1500 items from 3 different school/church/organizations based off their holiday food drives! All this kindness is what makes your mission able to reach so many! Perry Hall Community Chorale


The Perry Hall UMC Performing Arts Ensemble,
