Woohoo, it's June

cookouts, schools out, swimming, vacations, sunshine and warmth! All the joys of summer! While we are getting excited for the lazy days of summer – the pantry is in full swing! It is as busy as the lines to enter the local swimming pools on a Saturday!



In May we added over 10 new families and continue to serve old and new efficiently. Here are the stats through May 31st.

Days: 151 days since Jan 1st
 Pantry Days: 64 days (3x a week)

Households served: 665*
Individuals served: 1765*
Bags of food given: 7680*

Volunteer hours given: 769* (God bless you all!)

New families since January 1st: approx. 45
 (*estimating the last week of May)

The numbers tell it all! While June looks to be very busy for the pantry, we continue to meet the needs of those who need its help. All of the days that the pantry is open are completely scheduled (in fact most days are even 'overbooked') – that means at least 12 families are scheduled for every Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday!

PANTRY SUPPORT SYSTEM

As we continue to serve, everything continues to increase from the number of families to the cost of peanut butter! But your kindness and generosity help keep the shelves filled so the bags can be filled! It is all the donations – big and small – that help!

We love receiving the actual food donations (whether from food drives or the drop-off bins at Giant and Weis or just kind people who stop by! The hundreds of items that come to the pantry are always checked for their 'dates best used' and to make sure they are unopened and in good condition. After the items are checked then they go on the shelves. Once on the shelves they will be pre-bagged and given to a family within days.

But if you can't go shopping and you would love for us to go shopping – that is also a miracle for the pantry. The monetary donations, no matter the size, are what allows us to shop, shop, shop!! We shop at Aldi's and Dollar Tree at least every other week! Dollar Tree is where we buy hundreds of bottles of shampoo, bars of soap, boxes of toothpaste, bottles of detergent and jelly and rolls of toilet paper! Have you ever shopped for 145 families – looks pretty funny coming out of a Dollar Tree (actually it takes about 5 Dollar Trees!). At Aldi's, they supply our non-perishables – from spaghetti sauce to canned vegetables, ramen noodles to crackers. Fortunately, we can buy the cases at Aldi's, so it allows easier transport! Again, we buy in quantities of 60 or even 72! We may live on a budget – but your kindness is what makes it possible!! So yes, your donations are

hard at work and every penny becomes a life saver to a family.

Obviously, it is your support that keeps the pantry stocked! Thank you, thank you, thank you!

PLANNING A FOOD DRIVE!

With summer coming upon us, sometimes donations start to slow down because everyone is busy going on vacations, etc. With that said, it is



also a time to plan a food drive, as we have in the past.

Right now, we are thinking of having the food drive on Saturday, July 29th from 1-4 pm. We will hold the drive-by food drive in front of the church, like we have in the past. So start spreading the word! Donors will be able to just drive on up and drop off their donations without ever leaving their car!

But remember, you don't need to wait for the food drive to donate! We continuously depend on donations being dropped off at the Giant food box, the Weis food bin, and definitely at the pantry! Always know – your donations make a true difference in someone's life.

PANTRY GROCERY LIST – going shopping?

If you wonder what we continuously restock the pantry shelves with – well you would be amazed! We try our best to keep about a 6 day supply of each of the following items (6 days = about 72 families):

FOOD ITEMS:

Tuna fish - Cereal - Boxed /bagged rice or boxed mashed potatoes - Pasta, pasta sauce - Diced tomatoes - Canned pasta — Soup - Peanut butter — Jelly - Side dishes (like flavored rice or noodles) - Macaroni and cheese - Canned pork/beans, black beans, kidney beans - Canned pork/beans



noodles) - Macaroni and cheese - Canned beans: pork/beans, black beans, kidney beans - Canned vegetables: peas, potatoes, corn carrots, mixed vegetables, green beans - Canned fruit: peaches, pears, mixed fruit, applesauce - Ramen noodles - Boxed crackers or cookies - Canned chili - Canned meat like spam or canned chicken.

NON-FOOD ITEMS:

Shampoo - Soap – Toothpaste – Detergent -Toilet paper
