Winter has left! It is great to see the beauty of spring - the rebirth of all the flowers, the warm air returning, and our beloved Orioles

playing! While winter was mild (not one snow day was used!) it was still winter! The new year 2023 has been very, very busy for the pantry! Numbers tell the story!

All numbers are through April 29th.

Days: 120 days since Jan 1st Pantry Days: 51 days (3x a week)

Households served: 509* Individuals served: 1355* Bags of food given: 4581-5090*

Volunteer hours given: 721* (God bless you all!)
New families since January 1st: approximately 30-35

(*estimating the last week of April)

The numbers tell it all! The pantry continues to serve your community with love and fellowship. The approximately 9-10 bags of food and personal items given to each family once a month help give the families some comfort and needed assistance. While the monthly donations to each family do not last an entire month, they do make a very positive difference in so many lives!

PANTRY SUPPORT SYSTEM

We all live on a budget and without a doubt the increase in living expenses has affected everyone! The cost of gas at \$3.59 for regular, the cost of eggs at over \$3.50 a dozen, the cost of house or rent – well beyond belief --- everything has gone up at a rate not seen for decades. This inflation has caused everyone to learn how to 'budget' or at least try. The pantry is no different! The items given to families have not changed – but shopping and keeping the shelves filled continues to be dependent on the support of so many!

From the love and generosity of you, of Camp Chapel UMC, and from the community at large the pantry can weather



two MAJOR obstacles: increasing number of families needing help + the cost of food!

While some weeks we are blessed with large physical donations from food drives, other weeks are not quite as blessed. We use all monetary donations given to supplement any weak areas – so the shelves remained full.

Your continuous support to the pantry (either physical items or monetary items) is the life to the pantry! The pantry is truly grateful for your kindness, for your support, for your love! Always know that your donations matter, they make a difference, they are making families feel your love!

If you donate physical items, anything from the list below is what we continuously keep supplied! But donations of all and any in-date, non-perishable food items are welcomed and greatly appreciated! Please note that donations of personal items are very much needed, welcomed, and are outstanding (truly – these items are extremely appreciated!!) Finally, if your donation is monetary – that is awesome. We use all the monetary donations to go 'shopping' for the items that are in need (at Aldi, Dollar Tree, & Walmart mostly) as well as any gift cards from these stores. In other



words – every donation you give is a true gift and makes the pantry so successful! Thank you for your love, for your help, for your donations! But mostly, thank you for

your continued support!

PANTRY GROCERY LIST – going shopping?

If you wonder what we continuously restock the pantry shelves with – well you would be amazed! We try our best to keep about a 6 day supply of each of the following items (6 days = about 72 families):

FOOD ITEMS:

- Tuna fish
- Cereal
- Boxed /bagged rice or boxed mashed potatoes
- Pasta, pasta sauce
- Diced tomatoes
- Canned pasta
- Soup
- Peanut butter
- Jelly
- Side dishes (like flavored rice or noodles)
- Macaroni and cheese
- Canned beans: pork/beans, black beans, kidney beans
- Canned vegetables: peas, potatoes, corn carrots, mixed vegetables, green beans
- Canned fruit: peaches, pears, mixed fruit, applesauce
- Ramen noodles
- Boxed crackers or cookies
- Canned chili
- Canned meat like spam or canned chicken.

NON-FOOD ITEMS:

- Shampoo
- Soap
- Toothpaste
- Detergent
- Toilet paper

A Special Thank You to Allison Hecht


Allison Hecht, our 1st and 2nd Grade Sunday School teacher, is stepping down at the end of the Sunday School year this June.
