
A Message from The Pastor

Fall is upon us and the holidays are right around the corner! September has been a

busy month - schools back in session, vacations are over, and the pantry has been serving the families that are in need.

We served about 160 families this past month and added about 10 new families over the last two weeks (some brand new, others returning after being away for a few months). Generally, each month, since January, we have scheduled about 180 families to come to the pantry - with about 20 families needing to cancel and reschedule for another date. The phone calls for help continue and the appointment book is constantly updated - but the pantry always makes sure, that families are served!

As the holiday seasons start to approach, it is also the time of year when many organizations start planning holiday food drives. We have been blessed for several years with local schools and organizations donating the results of their food drives. What these food drives do is give the pantry 'extra stock' that may last for two months - versus 3 weeks! So if your school, social organization, business, etc. is interested in promoting a

As you already know, the pantry is totally dependent

on donations. The kindness and generosity of you, Camp Chapel UMC, the Perry Hall community, Weis Market on Joppa Rd, and the Maryland Food Bank have enabled the pantry to serve these 160+ families and give them some hope, love, and compassion. Thank you for helping to make this possible.

ANNUAL HOLIDAY BASKETS

For the last 2 decades, the church families have provided holiday baskets to families that needed help. These baskets contained food items for a family to enjoy Thanksgiving or Christmas dinner. This year, the tradition lives on - the goal is to be able to provide a holiday dinner for at least 50 families!

Starting October 1st, donations for the holiday dinner items will be accepted/collected. A table in the fellowship hall will be set to receive your physical donations over the next 7 weeks.

Every holiday basket/bag will contain one of each of these items:

- **Canned Sweet Potatoes**

- **Canned Mixed Vegetables**
- **Canned Peas or Carrots**

PLUS a \$15 gift card from Walmart for the turkey/ham.

The distribution dates that are planned are:

Definite: Thanksgiving Saturday. Nov. 22 Tentative: Christmas, Saturday, Dec. 13

TIME: 1-3 PM

Our goal is for at least 50 families. Depending on the success will decided if the Dec 13th distribution occurs. We recognize times are tougher for everyone and that

the generosity provided is a true blessing. So, what you are able to donate is wonderful.

Monetary donations: If you prefer to donate monetarily, the shopping will be done for you! Just drop off your monetary donations or gift cards in the Sunday basket OR stop by the pantry/office to drop it off.

Lastly: If you would like to help with the distribution on Saturday, Nov 22 - we would love your help! The work is easy - wishing the families a happy holiday and placing the holiday basket in their car! The more church members that help deliver the joyful holiday wishes - the better!! Hope you can join us for 2 hours of laughter, love, and holiday joy! :-)
